Trowse Parking Scheme





As you should be aware we are entering the final stage before implementation of the Trowse Parking Scheme. The scheme was designed to ensure that all residents of Trowse are able to park safely in the village. This scheme has been a long time in the making but entering this final stage does not mean that it is a done deal. It simply means you, as residents, will get to have your final say on if the scheme is implemented or if it needs to be amended before implementation.

With this in mind the Parish Council are keen to ensure that every resident knows exactly what the scheme means for your street. The Parish Council are looking to hold a set of clinics at the Manor Rooms especially to inform residents. The scheme is now in the hands of Norfolk County Council (NCC) and comments/ objections/agreements about it will have to go directly to the legal team at NCC. Details of how to make those representations and where to send them will be at the Parish Council clinics. Dates/time for these clinics are:

Friday 22nd July 7pm—9pm

Saturday 23rd July 12pm—3pm

Sunday 24th July 12pm—3pm.

The monthly Parish Council meeting on the 25th July will be specially dedicated to the parking scheme.

Tree Vandalism

Sadly, over the jubilee weekend vandalism to some trees on the church meadow was spotted by a resident. The tree in question has had the bark stripped off it in two places from ground to about 7 feet up the trunk and large gouges in the flesh. Sadly due to the extreme amount of bark that has been removed it is thought that the tree will not survive.

We'd like to think that anybody who stripped off the bark from this tree was unaware that they could cause the tree to die, as this would be a deliberate act. Living in a conservation area we would hope that people would stop and think about such actions.
