Your Neighbourhood Plan: The next step

Neighbourhood plans are created by your parish council, town council, or neighbourhood forum. They contain more detailed priorities for development in your community, such as the provision of low-cost housing or the preservation of green space. While Local Plans lay out a vision of future development for a whole area, the needs of individual towns and villages within that area can vary. Neighbourhood Plans are optional documents that detail further development priorities for individual communities. They are community-led and can be written by town or parish councils, or where there is no town or parish council by a specially-created neighbourhood forum.

You may recall, back when the pandemic was just hitting us, a small steering group of residents started to embark on our Neighbourhood Plan. Obviously we were hit with problems that faced all groups during the Covid outbreak, being unable to meet, delays due to workforce absence etc. However, we are now at the stage when we can look to bring this formal planning document and it's policies into practice. In order to do this we must complete a very important set of steps, sending the draft Neighbourhood Plan out for consultation again to make sure it is understandable and suitable for the village.



The Parish Council are now consulting on the Regulation 14 draft of the Neighbourhood Plan. This will run for 8 weeks from Monday 12 December 2022 to Sunday 5 February 2023.

The plan is available on the parish council website or in hard copy from the Manor Rooms.. There will be a drop in consultation event at the Manor Rooms on Saturday 14 January from 11-2pm which will be an opportunity to find out more about the plan and talk to those involved in developing it.

Keep Warm and Well with Norfolk Libraries
