Saturday 6th May

With Spring past approaching (we hope) we want to let you know some more details about what the Parish Council has planned for celebrating the Coronation of King Charles III.

Following on from our successful Jubilee party last year we are hoping to go bigger and better this year and make a day that will be full of fun for all the family. We have lots of activities planned on the common. These will include traditional fete games like Hook-a-Duck, Hoopla and Ball in Bucket. We will also have some not so traditional things like crazy golf, soft archery and giant Jenga. These will all be pocket money games and each person will get a small prize regardless of the outcome.

There will also be a tombola with some awesome prizes. Things like hampers and vouchers will be up for grabs so you won't want to miss out.

To keep it family and wallet friendly most games will be only 50p a go and all money raised will go to local charities.

Also raising money again this year will be the allotment holders plant stall. This was super popular last year and made a whopping £311. Andy has been liaising with the manager of the Whitlingham Trust and discussions are being had about how this can be stopped. PC Sneddon has already issued a dozen Anti Social Driving orders, which mean that if the drivers get caught again their car will be seized.

We will be keeping an eye on this and hopefully getting our additional Speed Monitoring Camera will go some way to stopping this.

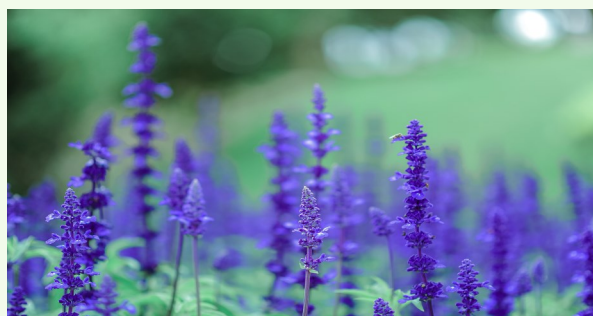
Polite reminder
