


Parish Council News

Weed It And Reap

Well, we have certainly had an interesting "summer". The weather has been pretty shocking but it all makes for good gardening, especially given the drought we had last year. With this in mind and it being the season for preparation, we would like to let you know that we have some vacant allotment plots and currently no waiting list. There are plots available on both the Dell and Block Hill and we are creating 3 micro plots on the Dell for first timers, (or not having much timers) to be able to have a go at a smaller plot before potentially committing to a big one. Now is the ideal time for preparing the ground for next springs crop planting, and the soil is nice and damp for easier digging.



If you've got green fingers, never grown a vegetable in your life, or have little to no garden, one of our plots might be for you. These plots will be available on a first come, first served basis. Don't worry if you miss out, if you want you can be placed on a waiting list and informed when another plot becomes available. If you visit the allotment page on the website, there is a handy Allotment Handbook which gives you an idea of the commitment levels needed when taking a plot. Chris is undertaking a full restoration of the sign which will enable it to be placed back in it's original location. There had been a lot of filler used in previous repair jobs and this time it is being done with wood infills and new carvings to give it a new lease of life. It had been thought that it would not be able to be placed outside again but Chris has told us that this will be possible and our much loved sign will be where it belongs soon.

Trowse Parking Scheme



We have seen some movement on this in recent weeks, and more details will follow. However, in the interim we can tell you that the PC attended a meeting at County Hall following the responses received by them to the public consultation earlier this year. The overwhelming response to the consultation was that the majority of respondents did not want permit parking in the village.

So, there will be no permit parking zones and the only changes to the current restrictions will be the addition of double yellow lines that extend from the start of the new White Horse Lane development, as far as the overpass, and around the junctions of Mustard Way/Pepperpot Drive. There will also be a restricted zone along this section to allow for school drop off/collection. A restricted zone will also be in place on the roundabout in front of the new school, again for school drop off/collection. New double yellow lines will also be placed on Old Hall Drive to help combat bad parking on football days.

This was a service for quiet reflection in memory of all our service men and women and was particularly poignant given the recent conflicts in the Middle East. Pumping Station Fire


